- > Write 5 paragraph essay biography (typed, 12 point font, 1 in margins) including:
 - o Introductory Paragraph
 - o Date of Birth
 - o Childhood
 - o Family
 - o Education
 - o Adult Life
 - o Notable accomplishments
 - o How they were viewed by contemporaries
 - o Concluding Paragraph
 - o Works Cited

Display Board:

>> Standard sized tri-fold board with pictures, maps, charts, etc. relevant to your character

One-Two Minute Monologue and Costume

- > You will choose 1-2 minutes of material from your report to present as if you ARE the character. (Dress, accent, etc.)
- ➤ Monologue should be memorized, but you may use 1 notecard with prompts.
- > Costume should NOT be expensive. Use what you have or visit a second hand store.
- >> Select a pose that is easy to maintain for the times in between your speeches.
- > Be creative and expressive.
